## Q1. What are the CELC modules available for UTown and RVRC students?

The Ideas & Exposition I and II (I&E1 and I&E2) Modules are offered to students from *Tembusu College, College of Alice & Peter Tan and Residential College 4*Please refer to the <u>Ideas & Exposition (I&E) webpage</u> for details on the module offerings and <u>timetable</u>.

The Professional and Academic Communication module (ES1601) is offered only to students from *Ridge View Residential College (RVRC)*. Please refer to <u>this webpage</u> for more details. The timetable can be found <u>here</u>.

## Q3. Can I select an I&E class that suits my schedule but is not hosted by my Residential College (RC)?

All eligible students will be able to view and select I&E classes hosted by any RC's. You are encouraged to heed your home College's advice with regards to the prioritising of UTCP module selection.

## Q4. Should I attend class in Teaching Week 1 & 2 if I have not received any appeal outcome?

#### For I&E modules,

Students who are successfully enrolled in a class after ModReg Select Modules Round 2 are to attend classes from 15th August 2019 in Week 1.

Students who are waiting for Round 3 or appeal results may attend any class in Week 1 and 2. However, attending the class does not guarantee a place in that particular class if your appeal has not been approved.

Please also note that there is limited seatings in the classrooms during these two weeks. Students whose names are on the class list will be given priority to have a seat in the class, remaining seats are available at a first come, first served basis.

There will be a catch-up session in Week 3 for students who are successful in their appeals for places but had missed lessons in Week 1 and 2.

#### For ES1601,

Classes start in Week 2, 19th August 2019.

## Q5. Can I appeal for a particular module if the class is already full?

You may be placed on our wait-list if the class you wish to enrol is already full. Please submit a manual appeal using the form provided in the table above.

## Q6. Can I exercise my S/U option for RC modules?

You may exercise your S/U option subject to your S/U option quota and home faculty's quidelines and approval. Please consult your faculty administrator.
