EdUcating for Peace and Cooperation

What is the European Union, how does it work and why is it important to Singapore, ASEAN and your role as an educator? For answers to these questions and more, the EU Centre invites you to attend a compact yet comprehensive- and free- one day workshop on "EdUcating for Peace and Cooperation". This workshop is targeted at teachers who are interested in learning more about the EU and its policies, how the EU is a major trading partner of Singapore and the region, how it cooperates in areas of economic competitiveness, environment, foreign and security policy, and what lessons Singapore and ASEAN can learn in regional cooperation.

The workshop promises to be informative and interactive. Participants will hear presentations by EU policy experts, then discuss, research, plan and share ideas on aspects of EU policies of relevance and applicability. Lesson plans and useful teaching resource materials will be developed from these discussions and compiled into a teaching resource booklet to be circulated to educational institutions. You can use these resources in your teaching in a range of disciplines and subjects such as for the General Paper, History and Economics. At the same time you can equip students with knowledge on how countries and regions work together to confront a wide range of issues from climate change challenges to the global financial crisis. More materials will be circulated during the workshop such as content to encourage young Singaporeans to be responsible global citizens.

The opening address will be delivered by His Excellency Holger Standertskjöld, Ambassador, Head of Delegation of the European Commission to Singapore. This will be followed by presentations by two EU policy experts, Mr Jørgen Ørstrøm Møller, and Mr Jan-Willem Blankert. Mr Møller was former Danish ambassador to Singapore, and prior to that was the State Secretary in the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Mr Blankert is currently the Special Adviser on ASEAN to the European Union. All teachers from secondary to pre-university are welcome to the workshop.

The workshop is conducted in tandem with the EU Centre's aims to promote understanding of the relevance of the EU and its policies, and how these policies affect Singapore and ASEAN. The EU Centre in Singapore also hopes to go beyond the workshop to form a lasting relationship with your institution in order to promote our common and valuable cause of education.
