- (b) Visitor Visa If you do not qualify for an eTA, you will need to obtain a Visitor Visa prior to your arrival in Canada. Please contact the High Commission of Canada in Singapore to start the process of obtaining the appropriate visa. The High Commission Officer might advise you to obtain a Study Permit instead since your time in Canada is primarily for studying. - (c) **Study Permit** Study Permits are usually reserved for students studying more than 6 months at a Canadian institution. To be eligible for a Study Permit, students must.
  - have been accepted by a designated learning institution in Canada.
  - prove that you have enough money to pay for your tuition fees (no applicable for SEP), living expenses for yourself and any family members who come with you to Canada and return transportation for yourself and any family members who come with you to Canada.
  - be a law-abiding citizen with no criminal record and not be a risk to the security of Canada. You may have to provide a police certificate.
  - be in good health and willing to complete a medical examination, if necessary.
  - satisfy an immigration officer that you will leave Canada at the end of your authorized stay.
