i) Module Mapping & Credits Transfer	<p>Please ensure that your Study Plan is approved by the academics at your home faculty before the exchange. You can check with the SEP Coordinator in the Dean's Office of your home faculty.</p> <p>Modules approved in the past might not be offered by the host university or approved by your faculty when it is time for your exchange. Please check the latest course offerings at the host universities while you are preparing your Study Plan.</p>

v) Curriculum Structure	Each single-term course at UVic is typically worth 1.5 units, which is equal to 6 ECTS credits.
vi) Entry Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) be registered as a full-time undergraduate student of NUS (b) have successfully completed at least two (2) semesters of study at NUS upon admission to the host university; (c) not be eligible for exchange in the graduating year (d) be a student of good standing at NUS with <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. a minimum upper division second class honours or; b. a minimum B average grade or ; c. a CAP of at least 3.5 (out of 5) for NUS students
vii) Language Proficiency Requirements	<p>The language of instruction at UVic is English.</p> <p>NUS students should display a suitable level of competence in English. Exchange students applying for undergraduate modules should possess</p>

	reasonable English proficiency level in order to follow the classes during the exchange term.

i) Procedures	<p>Nominated students will need to submit an online application via the following link.</p> <p>https://www.uvic.ca/international/inbound-students/exchange/apply/index.php</p> <p>Required Documents: Prospective incoming exchange students will need to letter mail hard copies OR email scanned copies of: recent passport-size photograph, copy of official transcript, list of currently registered courses.</p> <p>Acceptance email: Students who have been accepted to the UVic ISS Student Exchange Program will receive an email that includes: the student's UVic identification number, a letter of admission and information about preparing for UVic.</p>
ii) Deadlines	<p>All NUS student must abide by the internal application deadline set by their home faculty for exchange participation in the following academic year. After clearing the internal application and selection process, students have to take note of the application deadline set by the host university</p> <p>Failure to submit a formal application to the host university will result your exchange being forfeited even if you have been selected by NUS for the exchange.</p>

<p>i) University Accommodation</p>	<p>Residence Services at UVic offers on-campus dormitory rooms OR cluster units (private bedroom with shared kitchen and living room). For more information, please refer to the following link.</p> <p>http://www.uvic.ca/residence/</p> <p>Applying for On-Campus Housing: Once students have been accepted to the ISS Exchange Program and have received their UVic Student number (which begins with V00), and have created their Netlink ID, they may apply for on-campus housing. Students without a V00 number will not be eligible for on-campus housing. Residence application fee is CAD\$50 (non-refundable). F. Visa	
<p>Consular/Visa Regulation</p>	<p>It is your responsibility to obtain the correct documents from Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) prior to your exchange semester(s) in Canada.</p> <p>Depending on nationality, students may need any other following documentation before their arrival in Canada:</p> <p>(a) Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) - As of March 15, 2016, visa-exempt foreign nationals are expected to have an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) to fly to or transit through Canada. Exceptions include U.S. citizens, and travellers with a valid Canadian visa. 	<p>(b) Visitor Visa - If you do not qualify for an eTA, you will need to obtain a Visitor Visa prior to your arrival in Canada. Please contact the High Commission of Canada in Singapore to start the process of obtaining the appropriate visa. The High Commission Officer might advise you to obtain a Study Permit instead since your time in Canada is primarily for studying. To determine if you need a Visitor Visa, please refer to the following link, http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/index.asp</p> <p>(c) Study Permit – Study Permits are usually reserved for students studying more than 6 months at a Canadian institution. To be eligible for a Study Permit, students must.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • have been accepted by a designated learning institution in Canada. • prove that you have enough money to pay for your tuition fees (no applicable for SEP), living expenses for yourself and any family members who come with you to Canada and return transportation for yourself and any family members who come with you to Canada. • be a law-abiding citizen with no criminal record and not be a risk to the security of Canada.
