iv) Examination	Students are expected to attend the mandatory examination at the host university.
v) Curriculum Structure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Undergraduate: Bachelor of Science - Postgraduate: Master of Science - Postgraduate: PhD and other opportunities <p>TU Delft uses the ECTS shared by all universities in the EU. One academic year provides you with a total of 60 ECTS credits. 1 ECTS credit is equivalent to a study load of 28 hours. Bachelor's programmes at TU Delft consist of 180 ECTS and Master's programmes, 120 ECTS.</p> <p>Exchange students should be able to obtain a minimum of 24 credits per semester at TU Delft. At least 70% of the ECTS credits of the courses should be obtained at the faculty that you are enrolled in. Faculty Exchange Coordinators are allowed to make exceptions to this rule if the student would like to attend courses at another faculty or a joint programme that strongly correlates with the student's field of study.</p> <p>For more course information, please refer to http://www.studiegids.tudelft.nl/bbDefault.do?SIS_SwitchLang=en</p>

vi) Entry Requirements	<p>Students must have completed at least 4 semesters of bachelor level programme before studying at TU Delft.</p> <p>A minimum CAP of 3.0 out of 5.0 with no grade below C.</p>
vii) Language Proficiency Requirements	<p>Bachelor level courses are mostly taught in Dutch. Master level courses are offered in English. NUS students are expected to take master level courses taught in English at TU/Delft and should at least be in Year 3 Semester 1 (preferably Year 3 Semester 2) when on exchange to TU/Delft.</p>

i) Module restrictions and pre-requisites	<p>Only students in 3rd year and above are able to participate in SEP to Delft University of Technology.</p> <p>TU Delft Faculty of Civil Engineering & Geosciences and Faculty of Electrical Engineering, Mathematics and Computer Science only accept students in 3rd year second semester for exchange.</p> <p>Faculty of Applied Sciences (which includes Chemical Engineering study) limits students to research projects only.</p> <p>Bachelor level Architecture students are restricted to English-taught Bachelor minor programme; students who have completed three years of university study are allowed to choose a Master course package.</p>
D. Application	
i) Procedures	<p>All NUS student has to be nominated by NUS before they can apply for fee-waiver exchange at the host university.</p> <p>The application procedures and list of supporting documents needed by the host university can be found in the SharePoint.</p> <p>Please look for the SEP coordinator at your Dean's Office for the link to the SharePoint.</p>
ii) Deadlines	<p>All NUS student must abide by the internal application deadline set by their home faculty for exchange participation in the following academic year. After clearing the internal application and selection process, students have to take note of the application deadline set by the host university.</p>

	<p>Failure to submit a formal application to the host university will result in your exchange being forfeited even if you have been selected by NUS for the exchange.</p>
E. Accommodations	
i) University Accommodation	<p>The TU Delft International Office can arrange housing for international MSc students, exchange students and international BSc students enrolled in the English taught BSc programme in Aerospace Engineering. After being admitted, you will receive information on how to arrange accommodation through the University. Accommodation is not guaranteed, however. The number of incoming international students is increasing, while the housing available remains limited.</p> <p>TU Delft arranges accommodation in cooperation with the housing organisation DUWO. Both private and shared student units are available. All accommodation includes bed sheets, bedding and pillowcases, and a box with kitchen utensils for one. Almost all rooms are equipped with an internet connection and (shared) washing machines, and are close to the university (within three kilometres). There is some on-campus housing, but generally students live off campus.</p> <p>Exchange students will be offered 1 semester-contracts, with a maximum of one semester's extension only. Cancellations during the contract period are NOT allowed.</p> <p>Rents range from € 450 to € 850 per month, and accommodation can vary from private units to units with shared facilities. F. Visa	
Consular/Visa Regulation	<p>TU Delft will provide assistance to non-EU students in arranging visas and residence permits. Students will be required to meet any visa or residence permit requirements that pertain to studying in the Netherlands. Non-EU students coming to TU Delft must provide documentary evidence of having sufficient financial means for the period of stay. Visa application fee (entry visa and /or residence permit) fee is 300 Euros excluding administrative charges by TU Delft. Students will receive more information about this after they have been admitted.</p>
