Please check the latest course offerings at the host universities while you are preparing your Study Plan.</p> <p>Logistics are handled on a Faculty-exchange basis with the following NUS Faculties and Schools: NUS Business School, Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences, Faculty of Science, University Scholars Programme, and School of Computing. If you have any questions, please ask the advisors at your home School or Faculty's Dean's Office.</p>

iii) Exchange Duration	One semester
iv) Examination	Students should check the exam timetable at their host university, and ensure they can stay at their host university until after the end of the official exam period.

i) Procedures	<p>All NUS students have to be nominated by NUS before they can apply for a fee-waiver exchange at the host university.</p> <p>The application procedures and list of supporting documents needed by the host university can be found in the SharePoint.</p> <p>Please look for the SEP coordinator at your Dean's Office for the link to the SharePoint.</p>
ii) Deadlines	<p>All NUS students must abide by the internal application deadline set by their home Faculty for exchange participation in the following academic year. After clearing the internal application and selection process, students have to take note of the application deadline set by the host university.</p> <p>Failure to submit a formal application to the host university by the stipulated deadline, may result in your exchange being forfeited even if you have been selected by NUS for the exchange.</p>

Students accepted for the exchange to UNC-Chapel Hill are eligible for UNC-Chapel Hill Student Medical Insurance. Exchange students will automatically be enrolled in and billed for this student plan. It is billed directly to their student account.</i></p> <p><i>Students are highly recommend to take the UNC Student Health Insurance during their exchange period, but if students have insurance they hope to take with them, they may opt-out of the mandatory insurance by providing information about their outside medical insurance coverage.
