<p>ix) Module restrictions and pre-requisites</p>	<p>Business courses are restricted for exchange students and some are reserved for degree seeking students. Only general business courses may be available. Architecture, art, digital arts, music and product design have additional admission requirements and may have some course restrictions.</p>

<p>i) Procedures</p>	<p>All NUS students have to be nominated by NUS before they can apply for a fee-waiver exchange at the host university.</p> <p>The application procedures and list of supporting documents needed by the host university can be found in the SharePoint.</p> <p>Please look for the SEP coordinator at your Dean’s Office for the link to the SharePoint.</p>
<p>ii) Deadlines</p>	<p>All NUS students must abide by the internal application deadline set by their home Faculty for exchange participation in the following academic year. After clearing the internal application and selection process, students have to take note of the application deadline set by the host university.</p> <p>Failure to submit a formal application to the host university by the stipulated deadline, may result in your exchange being forfeited even if you have been selected by NUS for the exchange.</p>

<p>i) University Accommodation</p>	<p>During ISO (International Student Orientation): If you need housing before ISO begins you can stay with a host family or find a hotel.</p> <p>If you plan to live on-campus, you can apply for early move-in. Please note you can request early arrival when your housing assignment is emailed around August.</p> <p>How to apply for early move in:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Receive your room assignment. 2. Log on to the Housing Portal and sign up for early arrival. 3. There will be a fee per day that you arrive early. Please note this fee depends on the room you are assigned to. 4. Please inform exchange@uoregon.edu that you plan to arrive early so we can notify the Housing Department. <p>Please contact the Housing Department if you have additional questions. Apply here.
