Consular/Visa	The University of Virginia issues the Certificate of Eligibility for J-1 Status
Regulation	(Form DS-2019) to all international students that will be enrolled as exchange students. The DS-2019 form will be mailed directly to your home
	institution to distribute to you. The J-1 Exchange Visitor Program allows
	you to study as a non-degree student at the University of Virginia. The DS-
	2019 is required in order to apply for the J-1 visa. All non-immigrants
	require a valid visa stamp in their passports before coming to the U.S. under
	any non-immigrant status. An exception to this rule exists for citizens of
	Canada (and Bermuda under limited circumstances), who are visa
	exempt. All students must make sure that their passports are correctly stamped upon entry with their intended status.
