#### **COVID-19 related updates:**

In Summer 2022, UAB will be adopting a hybrid format for the summer programme. Some courses in the programme may be offered on-site and/or online.

Students' ability to travel to a country for Summer 2022 will be determined by the host country's travel policies as well as any updates to the latest travel advisory from Singapore authorities. Do factor in the need for quarantine in the host country and stay-home notice upon return to Singapore when considering the feasibility of participating in these programmes.

To be eligible for physical (on-site) summer programmes, students will need to:

- 1. complete the compulsory Overseas Travel Preparedness (OTP) module on LumiNUS;
- 2. submit a copy of their vaccination certificate and the completed <u>Risk Acknowledgement and ConsentForm</u> when applying on EduRec;
- 3. declare their travel plans on the NUS Overseas Travel Declaration Portal;
- 4. register with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs or your country's diplomatic mission; and
- 5. attend a pre-departure briefing conducted by GRO.

Students who proceed with the physical (on-site) option acknowledge the risks associated. NUS will not be responsible for any lost deposits or expenses (including but not limited to programme/tuition fees, air tickets, housing deposits, meal plans and/or non-academic student fees) associated with travel disruptions. Students are advised not to make any financial commitments particularly those which are non-refundable until they are certain that travel is possible. Students will be fully responsible for any and all travel expenses, quarantine accommodation costs, COVID-19 tests or other costs related to the measures imposed at that point of time, both in the host country and Singapore.

The UAB Barcelona Summer School is open to undergraduate and postgraduate students, both local and international. All undergraduates must already have taken at least half of their first-year courses. They should also have a good knowledge of the working language.

8	Module Mapping	Students interested in obtaining credit can start the module mapping process after you apply in EduRec and accept the offer for the programme. Module mapping request is subject to approval from the Faculties. Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for module mapping.
		Students may map up to a maximum of 10 MCs for each <b>on-site</b> Summer Programme and up to a maximum of 5 MCs for each Winter Programme. Module mapping will be subject to approval from the respective Faculties/Schools.
		Students who enroll in these Programmes may request for a waiver of NUS tuition fees for the credits they wish to transfer back to NUS. This waiver applies to up to 2 Summer/Winter Programmes and up to a total of 12 MCs transferred during their course of study in NUS. Beyond that, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. For clarification, students may contact the SEP administrators/coordinators at their respective home Faculty/School Dean's Office or the academic department. Business courses in summer/winter programmes which are less than 3 weeks are not credit bearing.

9	Visa Application	Students from countries on section 1 of the list need to apply for a visa for a stay in Spain of over three months to get their visas on time they should make their applications two months before the course starts, by writing to the appropriate Spain consular office, depending on where they live.  Students are reminded to check the Spain Consular Office in Singapore/home country for updates of the latest immigration policies via the website of the Embassy/Consulate and the information from the host university.	
10	Travel Advisories	Visit the MFA website for travel advisories on various countries from the Singapore government.	
11	Student Insurance	All foreign students at a Catalan university must have medical insurance coverage. The procedures for obtaining this coverage vary from country to country. Please check the requirements and information on medical insurance for non-EU students <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a> . Students are advised to read the page on practical information on healthcare insurance and visa <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a> .  NUS students are covered under the NUS Students Travel Insurance scheme for official NUS trips. Please refer to
