CUHK International Summer School

Established in 2004, the CUHK International Summer School (ISS) has been one of the most popular undergraduate summer programmes in the region. Each year, some 600 international and local students join the July and August Sessions of the ISS to experience its intensive academic sessions and Chinese culture activities in a multicultural learning environment. This is a great opportunity for you to gain a Hong Kong and Asian perspective from your peers and to explore Chinese culture through classroom learning, activities and field trips. Participation in ISS can be on exchange or study abroad (fee-paying) basis.









In the five-week programme, you can take up to two 3-credit courses, each with 42 contact hours, taught entirely in English. Areas of study include:

- · Environment, Science and Technology
- · Exploring Hong Kong
- · Global Business and Management
- · Society and Human Interaction
- · Understanding China
- Chinese Language (Putonghua and Cantonese)

August Session 3 - 24 August 2025

In the three-week programme, you can take two 3-credit courses of intensive Chinese language training in Putonghua at various levels. The programme will provide an opportunity for you to acquire pragmatic competence in the Chinese language through classroom learning and immersion activities.


