4	Academic Content	The International Summer School, New Delhi is an intensive, six-week academic program that brings together students from across the world. The 2020 session comprises of a 4-week academic session and an optional 2-week service learning experience. Distinguished academics from institutions such as the Jawaharlal Nehru University, Jamia Millia Islamia, Delhi University, Ashoka University, Shiv Nadar University, OP Jindal Global University among others from India as well as overseas will be delivering lessons on the following themes:  - Politics, Governance and International Relations - Growth, Development & Sustainability - Gender, Culture & Society - Technology, Innovation & the Future of Work  The optional Service Learning allows students to engage with India through a series of workshops, excursions and a volunteer experience to build on the knowledge gained from the academic sessions.			
5	Eligibility Requirements	NUS' generic eligibility requirements apply, please see <a href="GRO website">GRO website</a> for details.  The ISS requires students to be currently enrolled full-time in any higher education institution. The programme is open to both undergraduates and postgraduates. However, the GRO IEA is only applicable to NUS undergraduate students.			
6	Accommodation	During the four-week Academic Session, students will be staying at Hotel Samrat, and during the optional, two-week Service Learning experience, students will be staying in guest houses. 8	Module Mapping	If you are interested in obtaining credit, you can start the module mapping process after you apply in EduRec and accept the offer for the programme.  Note that all mapping requests are subjected to approval by the Faculties.  Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for module mapping.
		Students may map up to a maximum of 10 MCs for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 MCs for summer programmes. Beyond 12MCs, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. Visa applicants, including Singapore Citizens and PR, need to apply at the official Indian visa website.</li> <li>The ISS will ensure the provision of relevant documents that may help in the visa application process.</li> <li>Note: It is student's responsibility to ensure that they obtain a valid visa before making any travel arrangements for their summer programme. Students are encouraged to prepare and apply for visa as early as possible as obtaining a visa can be time consuming.</li> </ul>
