PROGRAMME DETAILS			
4	Academic Content	Courses run from Monday to Friday. For each week of study, you select a morning (Am) course and an afternoon (Pm) course. We offer a range of 5- and 10-session courses. Some 10-session courses run over one week and others run over two weeks. If you sign up for a 10-session course running over two weeks, you need to attend both weeks. Our 5-session courses run over one week. The maximum class size is 25 students. Courses fall into one or more of five different subject streams:	
		 Business and Innovation (including Finance, Marketing, Creating Innovative Ideas) Global Challenges (including Politics, International Relations, Climate Change) 	
		 History (including Archaeology, Medieval Studies, Ancient and Classical Worlds) Literature, Philosophy, the Visual Arts (Creative Writing, Shakespeare, Modern Literature, Art History) Science (including Psychology, Genetics, Sustainability, Astronomy, Physics, Microbiology)

Applying through EduRec-GE will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while overseas.	
		With an official application through EduRec-GE, you are covered by the NUS Travel Blanket Insurance. Besides, GRO can also provide you with supporting	



		letters for visa application. Read the step-by-step guide we prepared for you on GRO's website. You should also concurrently apply to the host university once you have applied to NUS Edu-Rec.	
8	Application Procedure at Host University	To apply for this Programme, you must submit an online application using the International Summer Programme Application Link .	
9	Confirmation of participation	To confirm your participation in this Programme, you must accept both the EduRec offer as well as the host university offer to confirm your participation in this programme.	
10	Course Mapping	All course mapping requests are subject to approval by the faculties/departments. If you are interested in obtaining credits for your course, you can start the course mapping process via EduRec-GE after you have accepted the programme offer. Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 units for involvement in the summer programme. Beyond 12 units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. Please read the information on the Office of the University Registrar's website for details.	
11	Transcript	Please provide a valid, personal mailing address in the online registration portal so the host can send your transcript to you after the summer programme. Please <u>do not</u> request that your transcript be mailed to the NUS Global Relations Office (GRO). GRO is not responsible for missing transcripts.

12	Visa Application	A Singapore passport holder does not require a visa for visits to the United Kingdom lasting up to 90 days. Please get in touch with the British High Commission in Singapore regarding the visa requirements for other nationalities.
