Students typically enroll in two courses/modules for the summer, which is equivalent to roughly 6 points (credits) at Columbia University. Please read item 8 of this info sheet very carefully to understand restrictions on module mapping and the number of modules you can map back to NUS. No exceptions will be made.

This summer, Columbia University is debuting their new Summer Session Focus Areas. The four Focus Areas for Visiting Students are crafted to ignite passions and sharpen expertise in diverse fields. They provide an immersive and targeted approach to learning, allowing students to delve deeply into the subjects that most fascinate them. These Focus Areas include:

- Arts and Culture in NYC
- Foundations of Pre-Medicine
- Public Affairs and Sustainable Futures
- Wall Street Prep: Economics, Finance and Analytics

Participating in the Focus Areas grants students access to enriching cocurricular activities. These experiences leverage the vast resources of both the University and New York City by enhancing their educational journey with unique outings and opportunities.

Students participating in the Public Affairs and Sustainable Futures or Wall Street Prep: Economics, Finance, and Analytics Focus Areas have the opportunity to join a Living and Learning Community (LLC).

Students participating in the Focus Area are also eligible for the Ambassadorship program, an exciting opportunity to enhance their Columbia experience and develop their communication skills. Focus Area Ambassadors will receive a monetary incentive, priority tickets for events hosted by Student Life, and valuable experiences to enhance their resume, particularly for careers in communications, marketing, and public relations.

		Students may map up to a maximum of 10 MCs for each summer programme. A total of 12 MCs from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional MCs mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees. Students should inquire with the SEP administrators/coordinators at their respective home Faculty/School Dean's Office or the academic department on being considered for a fee waiver. 9	Visa Application	Students admitted to study at Columbia University who are not United States citizens or permanent residents must be a full-time student at Columbia – registered for at least 6 points of credit-bearing courses in a 6-week session or 12 points of credit-bearing courses in the entire 12-week summer period – in order to be eligible for a student (F-1) visa.
