6	Accommodation	<ul> <li>In general, housing entails and includes:</li> <li>Double occupancy room accommodations on-campus</li> <li>Room includes bed, desk, wardrobe, and access to laundry facilities</li> <li>A meal plan is required and includes 15 meals per week for 8 weeks (length of programme).</li> </ul>	
7	Application Procedure	An exclusive link to the IHP application will be provided to students with an "Accepted Offer" status on EduRec as at 14 Feb 2025.	
8	Course Mapping	Students interested in transferring units can start the course mapping process after applying and accepting the offer for the programme in EduRec. Course mapping request is subjected to approval from the Faculties. Click <a href="here">here</a> for a step-by-step guide on applying for course mapping. Also note the following:	



Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme and up to a maximum of 5 units for each Winter Programme. Course mapping will be subject to approval from the respective Faculties/Schools. A total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional units mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees.
