Also note the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maximum of 2 modules (up to 10 MCs) can be mapped per summer / research programme during Special Term (May – August). • Maximum of 1 module (up to 5 MCs) can be mapped per winter / research programme during year-end vacation (December – January). • Total of 12 MCs from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition.
