Course Information	Undergraduate Minimum course load: 1.5 unit Maximum course load: 7.5 units (5 courses)  The regular semester workload for full- time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 7.5 units. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer.
	ICS: The ICS exchange program typically supports students taking courses in UVic's Faculties of Fine Arts, Science, Social Sciences and Humanities. Inbound ICS exchange students are restricted from enrolling in any courses in the following departments: Civil Engineering (CIVE), Law (LAW). Limited courses are available to inbound ICS exchange students in the following departments: Business, Education, Human and Social Development, Fine Arts, Engineering (Software, Mechanical, Computer, Biomedical, Electrical)  Business: Nominate students ideally should have completed a minimum of 1 year of business courses. Students who have taken Microeconomics, Statistics & Finite Math will have a larger course selection at Gustavson School of Business. Students who are nominated to Business exchange do have the option to take courses outside of Business but are subject to other faculty pre-requisites, criteria and restrictions
Accommodation	There are very limited spaces for on-campus housing, students should apply as soon as possible. Housing is not guaranteed.  The dormitory rooms include a mandatory meal plan. The Cluster units include private bedroom with shared kitchen and living room. You can begin
