Exchange Duration	One semester
Language Proficiency Requirement	It is recommended to have good command of French and/or English (level B2). Bachelor classes are taught in French and to some extent in English. English course offer varies from one section to another. Master courses are mainly taught in English.
	No language certificate is required for an exchange at EPFL. However, it is your responsibility to ensure that you have sufficient knowledge of French and/or English to follow the courses.
Course Information	(1) Minimum workload per term/semester: 20 ECTS (2) Maximum workload per term/semester: 30 ECTS The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 30 ECTS. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer. Visa	If you need a visa, the visa application must be submitted at least 3 months prior to the start of your study curriculum by means of the appropriate visa application form.
	All students are advised to apply for the necessary visa immediately after they have received the official offer letter/email from their host university.
	Foreign nationals who are not EU/EFTA citizens and who do not require a visa should consult the Swiss embassy or consulate in their country for the current entry and residence requirements and formalities.
