Exchange Duration	One semester
Application Requirement	Non-Chinese nationality (including Hong Kong, Taiwan and Macao passport holders)
Language Proficiency Requirement	Mandarin is the medium of instruction for classes at the host university (limited English-taught courses). NUS students with Chinese language background are exempted from the HSK Chinese language proficiency requirements to read Chinese-taught courses at Peking University.
Course Information	Exchange students are required to take 6 to 20 credits (approx. 2 to 10 courses) during their exchange semester at Peking University (normally 1 credit is equivalent to one hour of class attendance per week). The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 13 credits. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer. Most courses offered at Peking University are taught in Chinese. English courses are highlighted in the 'Remarks' column in the course information website. Courses may change, and the school/department reserves the right to enrol a student to certain course. The course information of the next semester will be published at the course information website around mid of January/July before course registration starts. Accommodation	PKU offers many dormitory types to international students: the Global Village (Zhong Guan Xin Yuan). The monthly rent is around RMB3300 - RMB4500. There is no attached bathroom in the rooms but there is bathroom on each floor. Online dorm booking will start in mid-July/mid-January at http://www.studyatpku.com . Please check the latest notice at www.isd.pku.edu.cn and apply during application window.
Visa	Exchange students are required to apply for student visa (X2 visa for those intending to study in China for a period of no more than 180 days and X1 visa for those intending to study in China for a period of more than 180 days). You will receive the admission letter and visa application form (JW202) once you are accepted by the host university for the student exchange programme. Exchange students from Singapore are required to apply for the student visa in person at the China Visa Application Service Centre in Singapore with the relevant documents before the start of the academic semester. Insurance	All full-time NUS students are covered under the university's Student Group Personal Accident & Medical Insurance and the Student Travel Insurance. International students at Peking University are required to purchase mandatory medical insurance according to regulations issued by Chinese Ministry of Education. The cost is approx. RMB400 per semester.
