Exchange Duration	One semester. <b>Semester 2 is recommended</b> due to the severe overlapping of academic calendar.		
Language Proficiency Requirement	Courses are TUD are primarily taught in German, although there are some classes taught in English.		
	German Proficiency is NOT a requirement but TUD recommends student to have at least an Intermediate German language skills (2 semesters of German) and participation in the 4-week German Language Course prior to the start of classes at TUD (for Summer Semester: March)

Course Information	A German semester runs 24 weeks – 16 weeks of classes, 4-6 weeks self- study and preparation for exams and 3-4 weeks exam period.		
Please read the important examination information below	The regular semester workload for full- time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 30 ECTS. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of		



credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer.

Visa	EU citizens and citizens from the following countries do not need a visa to enter Germany: Australia, Canada, Honduras, Iceland, Israel, Japan, Korea, Liechtenstein, Monaco, New Zealand, Norway, San Marino, Switzerland and the United States. However, after entering Germany, you will have to apply				



for a residence permit at the local "Auslaenderbehörde" (Immigration Office) if you are staying for more than three months.

Students from all other countries must apply for a visa for study purposes via the German diplomatic representation in their home country. **You must not under any circumstances travel to Germany on a tourist visa.** 

All students are advised to apply for the necessary visa immediately after they received the official offer letter/email from their host university. Some visa application process could take up to 2 months to process. Your exchange at the host university depends on the clearance by the immigration of the host country.

All students with non-EU citizenship need to prove that they have sufficient financial means to live in Germany (Either for the visa application or the residence permit). You are required to have at least €5.952 for a semester or €11.904 for a year at TU (€992 per month). There are two ways to prove that:

- 1. Scholarship: proof of a (full-) scholarship, stating duration and amount of monthly allowances
- 2. Self-financed stay: limited withdrawal bank account (also known as blocked account)
- 3. A third option may become available in the future, bank account statements from your bank account showing that you have at least €5.952 for a semester or €11.904 for a year at TU in your account. International students who do not come from a member state of the European Union (EU) usually need a visa before travelling to Germany:
- Make sure your passport is valid until at least 6 months after the end of your stay in Germany.
- Please contact the German embassy of your home country at least four months prior to your departure to Germany in order to obtain information on the specific visa regulations for your home country and make an appointment.
- Students from PR China and India: you have to apply through the APS in your country (PR-China: A-Verfahren/India: Process A), TUD will get you a group application number.

Some providers offer a very convenient online blocked account, e.g. <a href="https://www.expatrio.com">www.coracle.de</a>. Expatrio also offers a statutory health insurance from TUD's partner health insurance TK (Techniker Krankenkasse). These providers have a good reputation and a good online service.

#### **Insurance**

All full-time NUS students are covered under the university's Student Group Personal Accident & Medical Insurance and the Student Travel Insurance. Exchange students studying at TU Darmstadt for one or two semesters and double degree students are required to purchase statutory German health insurance (Gesetzliche Krankenversicherung) in order to be able to register as a student at TU Darmstadt.

- The insurance coverage is for one full semester (winter semester: October 1 March 31; summer semester: April 1 September 30) and will automatically continue if not cancelled.
- Every German statutory health insurance charges the same rate for students. TU Darmstadt cooperates with the health insurance "Techniker Krankenkasse" or "TK".
- It is possible to sign up for health insurance in advance if you need a confirmation for the visa application.

#### September OR March:

- Travel Insurance: Students have to purchase travel health insurance for the times and places that are not covered by the health insurance of your home country and the statutory German health insurance.
- Students participating in the Orientation & Intensive German Language Course in September (winter semester) and March (summer semester) are not covered by the statutory German health insurance and therefore must buy additional travel insurance before the departure to Germany.

It is also recommended that you purchase a comprehensive travel insurance for the full duration of your stay abroad, including your personal travel



	within/outside Germany. Please review your insurance coverages to ensure that they meet your needs.  Students are strongly encouraged to assess the risk of their intended activities and purchase supplemental insurance plans to ensure they are adequately covered during their time abroad.
Useful Links	Exchange students are exempt from paying tuition but required to pay a semester contribution of approx. €290 per semester. This includes free public transport in Germany (no high-speed trains) and access to the services of Studierendenwerk Darmstadt (cafeterias, dorms and more). Due to rising energy costs and a general inflation prices have been rising in Germany in the last years.
