Language Proficiency Requirement	Students are reminded to review the list of courses which are taught in English at Vilnius carefully.
	NUS student should be the equivalent of a B2 proficiency in English based on the Common European Framework of Languages. NUS students may submit their GCE "O" and "A" level certificate to prove English proficiency.
	Alternatively, students may submit a language certificate issued by NUS proving at least B2 English language level.

Please take note that examination in semester 1 is from early to late January at Vilnius University (Vilnius). NUS students are expected to stay and complete the examination in late January if they are going to Vilnius in semester 1. Students who insist on going for Semester 1 exchange has to seek explicit written permission from their home faculty for late return.

Earlier assessment at Vilnius University (Vilnius) is neither to be expected nor demanded while at Vilnius.

Visa	All exchange students from non-EU/EFTA countries shall obtain a national D-type visa.
	NOTE: If you have a valid residence permit or visa for the <u>purpose of study</u> issued by another EU country and come to Lithuania for an exchange programme, you may stay and study here without a Lithuanian visa for up to 360 days.
	Applicant must electronically fill out the request to issue a national visa through the Lithuanian Migration Information System (MIGRIS) and include digital copies of the documents listed below.
	<ul> <li>1. Valid passport (its copy and copy of all stamped pages):         <ul> <li>Its validity period being at least three months longer than the validity period of the requested visa</li> <li>It shall contain at least two blank pages;</li> <li>It shall have been issued within the previous 10 years.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	<ol> <li>Proof of sufficient means of subsistence (at least €519 per month + €1038 for the return to the state of origin);</li> </ol>
	<ul> <li>3. Health insurance:</li> <li>Covering the entire period of intended stay.</li> <li>Valid in all participant states of the Schengen Area.</li> <li>The minimum coverage shall be €30,000, including: emergency medical care, emergency hospital treatment, medical evacuation, along with accompaniment by a medical specialist, and repatriation.</li> </ul>

Insurance	All full-time NUS students are covered under the university's Student Group Personal Accident & Medical Insurance and the Student Travel Insurance. For more information on the university medical insurance, please refer to <a href="https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/">https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/</a> .
	All students who are citizens of non-EU member countries are required to obtain health insurance either in their home country or Lithuania.
	The cost of health insurance obtained in Lithuania may vary from around 50 to 150 EUR per year depending on the insurance policy (mainly on what part of the treatment cost is covered). This has to be done by contacting one of the private insurance companies if the student does not have a Permanent Residency Permit (if so, local THIF has to be contacted).
	Students from non-EU countries applying for the visa have to prove to the Migration Office that they have valid health insurance. The following requirements for the insurance contract (policy) have to be fulfilled:
	The health insurance contract (policy) shall guarantee that all basic medical assistance costs and travel expenses which may arise in connection with the return, for health reasons, of an alien to the homeland (medical transportation, including escort by medical brigade or a doctor) will be covered.
	The following information shall be indicated in the insurance policy:  - Number of the Health Insurance Contract (policy);  - Particulars of the insurance undertaking (name, address of registered office, telephone and fax numbers);  - Full name of the insured person;  - The amount covered by the Health Insurance Contract;  - Duration of the Health Insurance Contract (at least by the end of the study period);  - The territorial coverage of Health Insurance Contract (policy);  - Non-insured events.
