Exchange Duration	One semester
Language Proficiency Requirement	The language of instruction is in Norwegian/English. All international students are required to have a good command of English at an academic level and may need to provide TOEFL/IELTS test scores. NUS students may upload their GCE "A" level exam certificate along with the exchange application: https://www.ntnu.edu/studies/langcourses/languagerequirements .
Course Information	The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 30 ECTS. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer. Please note: 1. Exchange students can only select courses from one city. Please check the availability of English courses at the respective cities. 2. Course enrolment is not guaranteed. Exchange students need to be flexible with their course preference. 3. Accommodation	NTNU does not own any student housing but works with Student Welfare Organisation (Sit) to arrange housing for them. Exchange students who are non-EU/EEA/EFTA nationals going to Trondheim and Ålesund campuses are guaranteed Sit housing if they apply by the stipulated deadline.
