Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer.</p>
Accommodation	<p>Housing is not guaranteed for exchange students. If housing still has space remaining, students may apply for housing after they receive their official university acceptance. On-campus housing is assigned on a first come, first-served basis and placement is not guaranteed. On-campus housing may fill before students are able to apply.</p> <p>On-campus housing does require a non-refundable application fee (approximately \$125), which will be charged to the exchange student's ASU account.</p> <p>Housing information: https://goglobal.asu.edu/international/housing</p>
Visa	All students are advised to apply for the necessary visa immediately after they receive the official offer letter/email and instructions from their host university. Some visa applications can take up to 2 months to process. Your exchange at the host university depends on the clearance by the
