	Note: NUS students may only go for one quarter and must work out their credits to ensure this suits their credit requirements
Course Information	 Minimum workload per quarter: 3 units (approximately 3 courses) Maximum workload per quarter: 5 units, with advisor permission (approximately 5 courses)
	The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 5.625 credits. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the <u>SEP Credit Transfer Calculator</u> for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer.
Accommodation	Housing is not guaranteed, but students may apply for on-campus housing.

Some visa applications can take up to 2 months to process. Your exchange at the host university depends on the clearance by the immigration of the host country.
