Course Information	<p>Undergraduate Minimum course load: 12 credits</p> <p>The regular semester workload for full- time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 15 credits. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer.</p> <p>Cinema studies and psychology courses are not available. Law courses are not available for exchange students. Accommodation	<p>Housing is limited on campus and exchange students are encouraged to apply as soon as they are admitted and receive instructions. Students may live in a campus residence hall, apartments operated by the university (Bear Creek), or find an independent apartment off-campus. <p>Visa</p>	<p>All students are advised to apply for the necessary visa immediately after they receive the official offer letter/email and instructions from their host university. Some visa applications can take up to 2 months to process. <p>Insurance</p>	<p>All full-time NUS students are covered under the university's Student Group Personal Accident & Medical Insurance and the Student Travel Insurance. For more information on the university medical insurance, please refer to https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/.</p> <p>Exchange students are required to have health insurance that meets the US J-1 visa requirements. Exchange students may purchase campus health insurance or use their insurance from home if it meets the Visa requirements. Students must have proof of insurance.</p> <p>The CU Gold SHIP Plan health insurance meets visa requirements and may be purchased. Students who plan to use their current insurance while in Boulder are encouraged to add the supplemental BuffCare Coverage Program.</p> <p>For more details: http://www.colorado.edu/healthcenter/insurance https://www.colorado.edu/health/buffcare</p> <p>It is recommended that you purchase a comprehensive travel insurance for the full duration of your stay abroad, including your personal travel within/outside United States.
