Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer.
Accommodation	On-campus housing is not guaranteed. Students are encouraged to opt for off-campus housing.

Some visa applications can take up to 2 months to process. Your exchange at the host university depends on the clearance by the immigration of the host country.
