Exchange Duration	One semester
Course Information	The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 15 credits. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer.
Accommodation	On-campus housing through UW-Madison's Division of University Housing might be an option for incoming exchange students. On-campus housing is in demand and cannot be guaranteed. Students should be prepared to live off-campus given the limited availability of University Housing accommodations. https://studyabroad.wisc.edu/exchange/housing/
Visa	When you are admitted as an exchange student, UW-Madison will create an acceptance letter and a DS-2019 "Certificate of Eligibility for Exchange Visitor (J-1) Status" for you. You'll use these documents to apply for your visa. We will send you instructions on how to apply for the DS-2019 document. Read more: https://studyabroad.wisc.edu/exchange/visa <i>Note: All students are advised to apply for the necessary visa immediately after they receive the official offer letter/email and instructions from their host university. Some visa applications can take up to 2 months to process. Your exchange at the host university depends on the clearance by the immigration of the host country.</i>
Insurance	All full-time NUS students are covered under the university's Student Group Personal Accident & Medical Insurance and the Student Travel Insurance. For more information on the university medical insurance, please refer to https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/ . In addition, students will be required to enroll in the compulsory health insurance policy or scheme at their SEP host university. https://studyabroad.wisc.edu/exchange/insurance/ <i>Note: It is recommended that you purchase comprehensive travel insurance for the full duration of your stay abroad, including personal travel within/outside the USA, and review your coverage to ensure it meets your needs. Students are strongly encouraged to assess the risk of their intended activities and purchase supplemental insurance plans to ensure adequate coverage.</i>
