

Cartooning Enrichment Course

This course introduces the basics of Cartooning Skills. Students will use their imagination and creativity to express their own original ideas and also to enrich visual experience through Cartooning.

This is the first of a two-stage course. Each stage has eight lessons and the structure gives participants the time to learn and to develop their own styles in Cartooning.

07	Drawing Cartoon : Speech Bubble & Actions
08	Sketching : Turn your friends into Cartoons
