

Annex: NUS Day of Service – List of Activities

Environment

1. International Coastal Cleanup Singapore: Volunteers will conduct cleanup at shores and waterways by collecting, categorising, recording and removing trash.
Venue: Tanah Merah, Singapore
2. Bin Right!: This is a community awareness programme that aims to bring awareness to the NUS community and the public on the proper disposal of waste in recycling bins.
Venue: CitySquare Mall, Singapore
3. Soap For Hope: This is a project to reconstitute used soap bars from hotels for migrant workers in Singapore. Participants will try their hands at soap making from recycled soap bars and be involved in the distribution of soaps to the migrant workers.
Venue: College of Alice & Peter Tan, NUS
4. Tree Planting: The Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy Alumni - Bangladesh Chapter will plant around 200 saplings to mark its commitment to the environment.

Food

5. Door to Door Food Distribution with Food From the Heart: The NUS community will distribute food packs to 2,000 less-fortunate families at Food From the Heart's Self Collection Centres.

6. Groceries Shopping with the Elderly: This is a charity event to bring the disadvantaged elderly from the Lion Befriender Activity Centre on a groceries shopping trip.
Venue: Lions Befrienders Senior Activity Centre, Bendemeer, Singapore
7. Willing Hearts Soup Kitchen: Participants will assist in the preparation of ingredients, cooking and packing at Willing Hearts, a 100% volunteer-based, non-profit organisation that provides 5,000 meals every day to underprivileged and needy.

8. Serving with Love: Participants will visit the Salvation Army Peacehaven Nursing Home to provide a nutrition meal, conduct games, interact with residents, as well as carry out painting, cleaning, gardening service at the Home.

9. Mid-Autumn Festival Celebration: Participants will celebrate Mid-Autumn Festival with the elderly at the Chinatown area with music performances and games. Volunteers will interact with the elderly and provide house cleaning service for their homes.
Venue: Chinatown, Singapore
10. Fun, Laughter and Silver!: This is a community outreach programme organised by NUS Libraries to engage the seniors of the Lions Befrienders Senior Activity Centre through games, activities, lunch and lucky draws.
Venue: Lions Befrienders Ghim Moh Senior Activity Centre, Singapore

11. Tart-Making Day: Participants will make and taste tarts with the elderly. The event hopes to encourage more young people to engage with the elderly in the society and promote community service.
Venue: Moral Welfare Home, Singapore
12. RVRC Community Day: Participants will visit the Institute of Mental Health to bring smiles to the long-stay patients through interactive games, hand craft activities, sing-along session, special bento lunch and birthdays celebration. This event is organised in collaboration with the Central Community Development Council.

13. SG51 Arts and Crafts Session: Raffles Hall residents will celebrate SG51 with the residents of Sree Narayana Home for the Aged Sick. The programme includes performances by two Raffles Hall cultural groups, as well as arts and crafts activities and lunch with the residents.

14. Lunch with Bal Sahyog Children: Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy India Alumni Chapter will sponsor lunch for destitute children from Bal Sahyog, a non-profit organisation.
