About Iain Hay:

A highly motivated, successful, and strategic scholar and academic leader, Iain Hay is Vice-President of the International Geographical Union and Matthew Flinders Distinguished Emeritus Professor of Geography at Flinders University, South Australia.

He has served as foundation Dean (Education) in the College of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences and Head of the School of Geography, Population and Environmental Management at Flinders University as well as the Australian Learning and Teaching Council's Discipline Scholar for the Arts, Social Sciences and Humanities.

Iain received a BSc (1st Class Honours in Geography) from the University of Canterbury in 1983, his PhD from the University of Washington as a Fulbright Scholar in 1989, and a higher doctorate (LittD), also from the University of Canterbury in 2009. He is currently Professor of Geography at Flinders University, South Australia and since 2009, the Australia Learning and Teaching Council's (ALTC) Discipline Scholar for the Arts, Social Sciences and Humanities.

Iain became a Fellow of the Australian College of Educators (FACE) in 2009 and a Senior Fellow of the Higher Education Academy (SFHEA) in 2008. He has had significant advisory roles in projects which enhance the scholarship of higher education teaching and learning, including as an Expert Member for the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) Reference Group on the new national geography curriculum. Iain has also received several awards for his contributions to enhancing and promoting scholarly and creative teaching, including the Prime Minister's Award for Australian University Teacher of the Year (2006) and the inaugural Association of American Geographers' E. Willard and Ruby S. Miller Award (2010).

Iain's research focuses on geographies of domination and oppression, as well as qualitative methods and research ethics. He has published extensively and taken on editorial roles with several international and regional geography and higher education journals such as *Appl Geography*, *J of Geography Higher Education*, *Int Research in Geographical and Environment Education*, and *Ethics, Place and Environment*. He has written and edited several books, including *Inspiring Academics: Learning with the World's Great University Teachers* and *Making the Grade: A Guide to Successful Communication and Study* (4th Ed.). Iain is also the immediate past President of the Institute of Australian Geographers.
