Ella received an AICP show honor and has been included as a part of the archives of the Department of Film at the Museum of Modern Art (MoMA). She competed for the Sonya Award at the Busan International Film Festival with *Cold Noodles* (2010); the film also won Reel 13 shorts and later aired on the PBS channel. A web series she shot for Subway, *Confessionals* (2013), premiered at the South by Southwest (SXSW) film festival. Her short work *Play Your Part* (2012) was a finalist at MoMA for the AICP Show and was further screened in the Director's Guild of America (DGA) Theatre in New York and Los Angeles under Shoot Magazine's New Director Showcase. The piece was later awarded Best-Of-All entries at the Porsche Awards in Germany.



He has also worked as the Multimedia Producer for the Opening and Closing Ceremony of the 28th SEA Games held in Singapore and will be Multimedia Producer for National Day Parade '16.

Derrick Loo is a competent cinematographer who has collaborated with many award winning Singaporean filmmakers and due to his good eye for details. He has, over the years, lensed a huge variety of projects, including feature films, TV spots, documentary, short narrative projects, MTVs, corporate projects.
