4	Academic Content	The Class Schedule in the Berkeley Academic Guide has been updated with all			
		summer course offerings and we are happy to announce that there are still over			
		600 classes with open seats (as of 24 April 2020)! There are two types of classes			
		being offered, remote and online, please see the description of each below.			
		Online Courses: These classes are asynchronous in format. This means that			
		there are no lectures held in real-time. The courses are broken into modules			
		that need to be completed within a certain timeline. Students will have the			
		freedom to login at their own convenient time and listen to lectures, view video			
		clips, get reading assignments, post questions, take quizzes, participate in			
		discussion sessions, and submit homework. Course material, as well as technical support, is available 24/7. The instructor and GSI(s) will also be available during			
		virtual office hours that will be provided on the syllabus or at the start of the			
		course. You can find a list of online undergraduate courses through the Class			
		Schedule when you filter for "summer 2020", "online courses", "lower division",			
		and "upper division" in the left-hand column. All other classes in the Class			
		Schedule are remote classes (please see below).			
		Remote Courses: These courses were previously held in-person but have been			
		approved for virtual remote instruction given the complications with COVID-19.			
		The virtual format of each course will be at the discretion of the academic			
		department and course instructor. Many of these classes may be synchronous in			
		format and will adhere to the schedule lecture/discussion times listed in the			
		Class Schedule unless otherwise noted. If you are seeking specific information			
		regarding a remote course format, you may want to reach out to the instructor or the academic department offering the course for more information. Here are			
		instructions for how to find Department & Instructor Contact Information.			
		No Enrollment Requirements:			
		International students taking online or remote courses from their home country			
		will not need to meet the <u>full-time unit requirements</u> as these requirements are			
		only for students studying in the U.S. in F-1 status. Students may enroll in one or			
		more classes from any session or multiple sessions.

 Maximum of 2 modules (up to 10 MCs) can be mapped per summer / research programme during Special Term (May – August). Maximum of 1 module (up to 5 MCs) can be mapped per winter / research programme during year-end vacation (December – January). Total of 12 MCs from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional MCs mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees.
