An International and Interactive learning environment

Summer online promotes an international experience through joint research projects, culturally diverse students and staff and our extra-curricular offering. In previous years KCL has welcomed students from up to 90 countries, which makes their summer schools a truly global experience.

		Each module uses <u>on-demand and live teaching</u> to allow flexible and differentiated learning. The live lectures and seminars facilitate group discussion, debate and input between faculty and students. The modules bring elements of London into the online classroom with references to current research, linked learning material and guest speakers from prominent organisations and backgrounds.
		Modules are assessed to university standards and students receive a Record of Agreed Results (transcript), which facilitates credit transfer if needed.

Please login to King's Apply https://apply.kcl.ac.uk/. If you have not previously applied to King's, you will need to register an account in order to make an application.

Select 'NO' in response to 'Are you applying via a King's Approved Agent, King's Partner or Study Abroad coordinator? and SAVE.

As NUS is King's partner university, you **do not require a partner code** to enjoy the benefits offered by King's, however please remember to fill in "National University of Singapore" as the home institution in your application to KCL Summer Programme. All NUS students enjoy application fee waiver of £60 and discounted tuition fee.

The application process will take approximately 7 working days. Please do ensure that your application form is as complete as possible to speed up the process.

6 | Module Mapping

Students interested in obtaining credit can start the module mapping process after you apply in EduRec and accept the offer for the programme. Module mapping request is subject to approval from the Faculties. <u>Click here</u> for a step-by-step guide on applying for module mapping.

Please note that NUS Business School and School of Computing (SoC) will not be approving module mappings from the e-summer programmes.

Students may map up to a maximum of 10 MCs for each Summer Programme and up to a maximum of 5 MCs for each Winter Programme. Module mapping will be subject to approval from the respective Faculties/Schools.

Students who enroll in these Programmes may request for a waiver of NUS tuition fees for the credits they wish to transfer back to NUS. This waiver applies to up to 2 Summer/Winter Programmes and up to a total of 12 MCs transferred during their course of study in NUS. Beyond that, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. For clarification, students may contact the SEP administrators/coordinators at their respective home Faculty/School Dean's Office or the academic department. Business courses in summer/winter programmes which are less than 3 weeks are not credit bearing.
