7	Application Procedure at NUS	Please apply through the NUS Education Records System - Global Education (EduRec-GE) first if you want to do module mapping and apply for financial aid/loans. Applying through EduRec-GE will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while overseas.	
		With an official application through EduRec-GE, you are covered by the NUS Travel Blanket Insurance. Besides, GRO can also provide you with supporting letters for visa application. Read the step-by-step guide we prepared for you on GRO's website.	
		You should also concurrently apply to the host university once you have applied to NUS Edu-Rec.	
8	Application Procedure at Host University	To register for MISU, view the course listings online, select your course and apply directly to the respective <u>German Language Course</u> or <u>Summer Academy</u> .	
		Every course has its application procedures, which are fully explained on its webpage. Please read the course description and schedule carefully before applying since some courses have additional class meeting times or specific enrolment requirements. Early application is always advisable as places are limited. Applicants have to be at least 18 years old to participate in MISU courses.	
9	Confirmation of participation	To confirm your participation in this Programme, you must accept both the EduRec offer and the host university's offer to confirm your participation in this programme.	
		Please read the cancellation policy on MISU's website before accepting and paying for the programme.	
10	Course Mapping	All course mapping requests are subject to approval by the faculties/departments.	
		If you are interested in obtaining credits for your course, you can start the course mapping process via EduRec-GE after you have accepted the programme offer.	
		Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 units for involvement in the summer programme. Beyond 12 units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to	



	the host university. Please read the information on the Office of the University Registrar's website for details.
11 Transcript	Please provide a valid, personal mailing address in the online registration portal so the host can send your transcript to you after the summer programme. Please <u>do not</u> request that your transcript be mailed to the NUS Global Relations Office (GRO). GRO is not responsible for missing transcripts.

12	Visa Application	Holders of a Singapore passport do not require a visa for visits to Germany lasting up to 90 days. For other nationalities, please enquire with the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany in Singapore for visa requirements.
		If you need a visa to enter Germany, please start early, as your visa application may take up to 2 months.
13	Travel Advisories	Visit the MFA website for travel advisories from the Singapore government in various countries.
14	Student Insurance	NUS will continue to offer NUS Travel Insurance for approved study abroad programmes, including summer/winter programs (SWP).
