6	Accommodation	<p>The Programme offers accommodation to the participants in student residential halls or hostels. The accommodation/housing fee varies from €300 - €510 depending on factors such as the type of room (double room/single room; with shower/toilet on each floor/with shower and toilet) and duration.</p> <p>Refer to the respective programmes for the cost/types of accommodation.</p>
7	Application Procedure at NUS	<p>Apply via the <u>NUS Education Records System (EduRec - GE)</u> first if you want to do module mapping and apply for financial aid/loans. Applying through EduRec-GE will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while you are overseas.</p> <p>With an official application through EduRec-GE, you are covered by the NUS Travel Blanket Insurance. Besides, GRO can also provide you with supporting letters for visa application. Read the step-by-step guide which we have prepared for you on <u>GRO's web</u>.</p> <p>You should also apply to the host university concurrently once you have applied to NUS EduRec.</p>
8	Application Procedure at MISU	<p>To register for MISU, view the course listings online, select your course and apply directly to the respective <u>German Language Course</u> or <u>Summer Academy</u>.</p> <p>Every course has its own application procedures, explained in full on its webpage. Please read the course description and schedule carefully before applying, since some courses have additional class meeting times or specific enrollment requirements. Early application is always advisable as places are</p>

		limited. Applicants have to be at least 18 years old to participate in MISU courses.
9	Confirmation of participation	Accept the EduRec-GE offer as well as the host university offer to confirm your participation in this programme. Please read the cancellation policy on MISU's website before accepting and paying for the programme.
10	Module Mapping	All mapping requests are subjected to approval by the Faculties/Departments. Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for module mapping. Students may contact the SEP administrators/coordinators at their respective home Faculty/School Dean's Office or the academic department for module mapping. NUS Business School will not consider a summer programme of fewer than three weeks duration to be credit-bearing. If you are interested in obtaining credits, you can start the module mapping process after you have accepted the offer for the programme via EduRec-GE. Students may map up to a maximum of 10 MCs for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 MCs for involvement in summer programme. Beyond 12MCs, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. 11	Transcript	Please provide a valid, personal mailing address in the online registration portal so that the host can send your transcript after the summer programme. Please do not request for your transcript to be mailed to NUS Global Relations Office (GRO). GRO is not responsible for missing transcripts.

12	Visa Application	Singaporeans do not need a visa for Europe if they are not staying for more than 90 days in Schengen countries in a 6-month period. If you need a visa to enter, please: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Apply for a tourist visa 2. Start early – your visa application may take up to 2 months 3. Make payment for the course early – you will only receive the official invitation (which you need for your visa), after the advance payment/full payment is received 4. Ensure that your visa allows you to travel to Germany, Czech Republic and Austria
