Your status when applying to the host university (University of Copenhagen) is "Non-EU/EEA without permanent Danish residence permit".</p> <p>Thereafter, inform Jasper Tang via email (grottd@nus.edu.sg) about the course(s) you applied for. You will then be provided instructions on applying via EduRec (a critical step for your module mapping and financial aid applications). You must accept both the EduRec offer as well as the host university offer to confirm your participation in this programme.</p> <p>Please read the application guide before applying for the programme</p>
8	Course Mapping	<p>All course mapping requests are subjected to approval by the Faculties/Departments.</p> <p>If you are interested in obtaining credits for your course, you can start the course mapping process after you have accepted the offer for the programme via EduRec-GE.</p> <p>Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 units for involvement in summer programme. Beyond 12 units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. For details, please read the information on Registrar's Office website.</p>
