4	Academic Content	Convened by the Department of Political Science at Jamia Millia Islamia — A Central University and the Esya Centre, the International Summer School (ISS) is a six-week academic, professional and cultural experience facilitated in the heart of India's capital city, New Delhi. ISS follows a multidisciplinary exploration of India's foundational principles through a six-week programme divided into 2 components: 1. A four-week academic session with 2 course modules conducted in Delhi 2. An internship and service learning experience held in Delhi/NC with				
		leading business and non-profit organisations. Studnts can extend their internship by two weeks should they wish to continue the programme beyond the first four weeks.

Applying through EduRec-GE will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while overseas. With an official application through EduRec-GE, you are covered by the NUS Travel Blanket Insurance. Besides, GRO can also provide you with supporting letters for visa application. Read the step-by-step guide we prepared for you on GRO's website. You should also concurrently apply to the host university once you have applied to NUS EduRec-GE.

	Host University	Applicants must submit some preliminary details about themselves through a simple, online application form, and shortlist applicants will be requested to submit a statement of purpose, letter of recommendations, and other documents requested by ISS over email.
		Deadline for application is 30 Apr 2025.
9	Confirmation of participation	To confirm your participation in this programme, you must accept both the EduRec offer and the host university's offer to confirm your participation in this programme.
10	Course Mapping	All course mapping requests are subject to approval by the faculties/departments.
		If you are interested in obtaining credits for your course, you can start the course mapping process via EduRec-GE after you have accepted the programme offer.
		Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each summer programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 units for involvement in the summer programme. Beyond 12 units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. Please read the information on the Office of the University Registrar's website for details.
11	Transcript	Please provide a valid, personal mailing address in the online registration portal so the host can send your transcript to you after the summer programme.
		Please <u>do not</u> request that your transcript be mailed to the NUS Global Relations Office (GRO). GRO is not responsible for missing transcripts.

12	Visa Application	Holders of a Singapore passport are required to obtain a visa before travelling to India. The Indian e-Visa is valid for entry through designated airports, including Delhi. Singaporeans need to apply for the e-Visa prior to arrival, and secure the necessary approval before departing for India. Please refer to the High Commission of India in Singapore for the most updated information.
