1	Programme Fee	Application Fee - JPY 5,000 The application fee must be paid before application submission by credit card ONLY and is strictly non-refundable. Applicants must fill in the receipt number of application fee on their application form.
		Program Fee - In-person format: JPY 180,000 (1 unit course) / JPY 360,000 (2 unit course) - Online format: JPY 35,000 (0.5 unit course) The program fee must be paid in full after admission is confirmed in April by credit card ONLY.
		NUS students are eligible for a 15% discount on the programme fees.
2	Financial Aid Available Through NUS GRO	Financial Aid options will not be available for programmes/classes that are conducted fully online. If programmes are hybrid, only on-site participation would qualify a student for financial aid. If a physical/on-site programme switches to fully online before the commencement of the programme, NUS reserves the right to adjust or retract the financial aid package.
		You should have enough monetary funds to last you throughout the whole i-SP. Your decision to go on i-SP should not be dependent upon the confirmation of a scholarship or bursary award. You can consider the following financial aid options to fund your i-SP:

5	Accommodation	No campus housing is available and students are responsible for arranging their own accommodation. However, UTokyo GUC staff will assist students with finding accommodation information in the Tokyo area, which has a range of affordable options for short-term stays. Payment for accommodations is the sole responsibility of the students.
6	Application Procedure	 1. You must apply concurrently via EduRec (in order to be able to proceed with module mapping and submission of financial aids application) and host university online application website (applications are accepted via T-cens SP Online Application System only) 2. You must accept both the EduRec offer and host university offer in order to confirm your participation in this programme. ✓ Only upon acceptance of the EduRec offer can you proceed with module mapping and apply for financial aid. ✓ Applying on EduRec will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of



		crisis/emergency while you are overseas. With an official application through EduRec, you will also be able to request GRO for supporting letters for visa application and NS deferment (for NSmen).

7	Module Mapping	You can start the course mapping process upon meeting the following conditions: 1. After you apply in EduRec.
		2. After you receive and accept the EduRec offer for the programme.

		For clarification, students may contact the SEP administrators/coordinators at their respective home Faculty/School Dean's Office or the academic department before applying for the programme.
		Students may map up to a maximum of 10 Units for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 Units for summer programmes. Beyond 12 Units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. For details, visit the Registrar's Office website . Note: Course mapping request is subjected to approval from the Faculties.

8	Visa Application	 Refer to this website https://www.sg.emb-japan.go.jp/itpr_en/visit.html for the most-updated immigration and border guidelines. Visas are not required only for students from countries and regions with reciprocal visa exemptions arrangements with Japan. The list of countries with visa exemption is available at the https://www.sg.emptions.goognate-website. Singapore citizens do not require a visa to enter Japan. For those who need a visa to enter Japan, a 'Certificate of Admission' and an 'Invitation Letter' for your visa application will be provided by the host university after they accept you and confirm you have paid the programme fee. Note: It is student's responsibility to ensure that they obtain a valid visa before making any travel arrangements for their summer programme. Students are encouraged to prepare and apply for visa as early as possible as obtaining a visa can be time consuming.
