*The programme period overlaps slightly with NUS Semester 2, please check with your home faculty whether you are required to apply for a short-term LOA. Otherwise, please keep your lecturers informed that you will be missing some classes in week 1.

COVID-19 related updates:

Students may be considering physical (on-site) winter programmes in 2021. Due to the fluid situation of the COVID-19 pandemic, there is still much uncertainty regarding international travel in the months ahead.

Students' ability to travel to a country for winter 2021 will be determined by the host country's travel policies as well as any updates to the latest travel advisory from Singapore authorities. Do factor in the need for quarantine in the host country and stay-home notice upon return to Singapore when considering the feasibility of participating in winter programmes.

To be eligible for physical (on-site) winter programmes, students will need to:

1. complete the compulsory Overseas Travel Preparedness (OTP) module on LumiNUS;
2. submit a copy of their vaccination certificate and the completed [Risk Acknowledgement and Consent Form](#) when applying on EduRec;
3. declare their travel plans on the [NUS Overseas Travel Declaration Portal](#);
4. register with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs or your country's diplomatic mission; and
5. attend a pre-departure briefing conducted by GRO.

Students who proceed with the physical (on-site) option acknowledge the risks associated. NUS will not be responsible for any lost deposits or expenses (including but not limited to programme/tuition fees, air tickets, housing deposits, meal plans and/or non-academic student fees) associated with travel disruptions. Students are advised NOT to make any financial commitments particularly those which are non-refundable until you are certain that travel is possible. You will be fully responsible for any and all travel expenses, quarantine accommodation costs, COVID-19 tests or other costs related to the measures imposed at that point of time, both in the host country and Singapore.

*As announced on 8 October 2021, Singapore and South Korea will be launching a Vaccinated Travel Lane (VTL) from 15 November 2021. Please refer to the [Korean Embassy website](#) for more information on eligibility and requirements.

9	Visa Application	<p>Students from countries or regions where Korea has signed a Visa waiver agreement may enter Korea without a visa for the winter programme. Singaporeans are not required to obtain a visa.</p> <p>Given the Covid-19 pandemic, Korea has suspended visa-waiver agreements for most countries, including Singapore. Students must apply for a short-term study visa (D-2-8) on their own in order to participate in on-site summer/winter programmes. More information can be found at the Korean Embassy website.</p> <p>It is the student's responsibility to ensure that they obtain a valid visa before making any travel arrangement for their winter programme. Obtaining a visa may be time consuming. Students are encouraged to prepare and apply for a visa as early as possible. The host university will send the documents required for your visa application to the address that you have indicated on your application for the winter programme after you have completed the payment for the programme. Kindly ensure that you have indicated your address correctly to avoid any delays.</p> <p>If you require GRO to issue a supporting letter for your visa application, you may download this form and follow the instructions listed within (after you have applied in EduRec and received confirmation of acceptance from the host university).</p>

11	Student Insurance	<p>NUS will continue to offer NUS Travel Insurance for approved study abroad programmes including international Summer Programmes (i-SP).
