3	Content	Service Learning Malaysia is a course-based educational experience in which students participate in a structured service activity that meets identified community needs. They will reflect on their service activity and experiences and relate them to the desired learning outcomes, in such a way they will gain deeper understanding of course content, a broader appreciation of the discipline, enhanced sense of personal values and civic responsibility.

5	Application Procedure	<p>Indicate your interest via this form. Thereafter, you will receive an email by GRO containing further instructions on application through EduRec-GE (critical for module mapping and financial aid application) and the host university website. You must accept both the EduRec offer as well as the host university offer to confirm your participation in this programme.</p> <p>✓ Only upon acceptance of the EduRec offer can you proceed with course mapping and apply for financial aid. Applying on EduRec will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while you are overseas.</p>
6	Course Mapping	<p>You can start the course mapping process after you apply in EduRec and accept the offer for the programme.</p> <p>For clarification, students may contact the SEP administrators/coordinators at their respective home Faculty/School Dean's Office or the academic department before applying for the programme.</p> <p>Students may map up to a maximum of 10 Units for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 Units for summer programmes. Beyond 12 Units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. For details, visit the Registrar's Office website.</p> <p>Course mapping requests are subjected to approval from the Faculties.</p>
