You will choose three modules to study during each three-week period.</p> <p>Modules are grouped by session – weeks 1-3 or 4-6 – and split into four categories: A, B, C and D. Students will choose three modules per 3-week session, selecting from 3 different categories. (For example, you will not be able to take two modules from category A.) 5	Eligibility Requirements	<p>Students who wish to join the International Summer School must meet the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will be a current student at undergraduate or postgraduate level, or have completed an undergraduate degree at a university worldwide You will be aged 18 or over on the first day of the course. <p>NUS' generic eligibility requirements apply. Please refer to the GRO website for details.</p>
6	Accommodation	<p>Refer to the host university website for the accommodation arrangements. Should university-arranged accommodation not be available, you will be responsible for securing your accommodation.</p>
7	Application Procedure at NUS	<p>Please apply through the NUS Education Records System - Global Education (EduRec-GE) first if you want to do module mapping and apply for financial aid/loans. Applying through EduRec-GE will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while overseas.</p> <p>With an official application through EduRec-GE, you are covered by the NUS Travel Blanket Insurance. Besides, GRO can also provide you with supporting letters for visa application. Read the step-by-step guide we prepared for you on GRO's website.</p> <p>You should also concurrently apply to the host university once you have applied to NUS Edu-Rec.</p>

9	Confirmation of participation	<p>To confirm your participation in this Programme, you must accept both the EduRec offer and the host university's offer to confirm your participation in this programme.</p>
10	Course Mapping	<p>All course mapping requests are subject to approval by the faculties/departments.</p> <p>If you are interested in obtaining credits for your course, you can start the course mapping process via EduRec-GE after you have accepted the programme offer.</p> <p>Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 units for involvement in the summer programme. Beyond 12 units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. Please read the information on the Office of the University Registrar's website for details.</p>
11	Transcript	<p>Please provide a valid, personal mailing address in the online registration portal so the host can send your transcript to you after the summer programme.</p> <p>Please do not request that your transcript be mailed to the NUS Global Relations Office (GRO).
