Due to the COVID-19 situation, University of Glasgow is offering online courses for Summer 2021. These exciting courses will allow you to study your course of choice in-depth, in small class sizes to maximise the chance to engage with your fellow students, and enjoy interacting with, and being taught by, world-class academics. You will also be able to enjoy their online social programme with activities and events running each week.

Students may apply for module mapping and transfer a maximum of eight (8) MCs (this is applicable only to electronic summer programmes 2021). Please note that some Schools or Faculties (including School of Computing) will not approve module mapping for remote or online courses. Please check with your home School or Faculty Dean's Office to determine if module mapping can be approved for remote/online courses before applying to the partner university.

Please refer to the individual courses for details.
5	Application Procedure at Host University	<p>Applications open on 20 January 2021.</p> <p>You may apply here.</p>
6	Application Procedure at NUS	<p>You should apply to Glasgow first and receive the official acceptance letter from Glasgow before informing GRO.</p> <p>You may email Ashlynn at ashlynn@nus.edu.sg once you have received your acceptance from Glasgow detailing the courses chosen and period(s) of study. Once GRO has received the confirmation that you are accepted to the Glasgow Summer Programme, the module will be created in the NUS EduRec System for you to register and do module mapping.</p> <p>In addition, applying through EduRec will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while you are overseas. With an official application through EduRec, GRO can also provide you with supporting letters for visa application and NS deferment (for NSmen). Read the step-by-step guide which we have prepared for you on GRO's web.</p> <p>Please note that you must accept <u>both</u> the EduRec offer as well as the host university offer in order to confirm your participation in this programme.</p>
