Due to the COVID-19 situation, the 2021 University College London Summer School will be delivered fully online. Delivery of the UCL online summer courses will be informed by world-leading research at the UCL Institute of Education (ranked #1 in the world for Education, QS 2014-2021) and UCL will offer additional opportunities for cultural enrichment and meeting others on the programme through a series of virtual events and activities.

Students may apply for module mapping and transfer a maximum of eight (8) MCs (this is applicable only to electronic summer programmes 2021). Please note that some Schools or Faculties (including School of Computing) will not approve module mapping for remote or online courses. Please check with your home School or Faculty Dean's Office to determine if module mapping can be approved for remote/online courses before applying to the partner university.

7	<b>Application Procedure at NUS</b>	<p>You are <b>REQUIRED TO</b> apply via NUS' <a href="#">EduRec-GE</a> <b>AND</b> the host university's website <u>concurrently</u>.</p> <p>Please apply through NUS EduRec System if you want to do module mapping and apply for financial aid. Applying through EduRec will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while you are overseas. With an official application through EduRec, GRO can also provide you with supporting letters for visa application and NS deferment (for NSmen). Read the step-by-step guide which we have prepared for you on <a href="#">GRO's web</a>.</p> <p>Please note that you must accept <u>both</u> the EduRec offer as well as the host university offer in order to confirm your participation in this programme.</p>
