E. Course Information	Exchange students must take a minimum of 37.5 points or 50 points per semester. Each course usually carries 12.5 points. Please note that the maximum workload is 50 points per semester. The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 50 points. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer. All exchange students must hold a current visa which entitles them to study
for the full duration of their programme. Typically, this is a subclass 500
student visa and student should obtain the visa before arriving in Australia.

Students are advised to apply for the necessary visa immediately after they received the official offer letter/email from their host university. This is to ensure that you can obtain your visa in time before the start of your exchange term. Your exchange at the host university depends on the clearance by the immigration of the host country.

All visas are subject to conditions and students must ensure they always comply with the conditions of their visa.

H. Insurance

All international students studying in Australia are required to purchase an approved Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) policy. OSHC is compulsory requirement for obtaining an Australian subclass 500 (student) visa. Students can purchase OSHC through your host university. It is recommended that you purchase a comprehensive travel insurance for the full duration of your stay abroad, including your personal travel within/outside Australia. Please review your insurance coverages to ensure that they meet your needs.

Students are strongly encouraged to assess the risk of their intended activities and purchase supplemental insurance plans to ensure they are adequately covered during their time abroad.
