Course Information	Undergraduate Level Maximum enrollment: 15 credits The regular semester workload for full- time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 15 credits. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer. Courses are generally 3 credits each. 3 credit courses are offered 3 hours/week over a 13-week term = 39 contact hours. Accommodation	On-campus housing is guaranteed to all exchange students who start in September and apply by the April 30 deadline.
	The housing guarantee does not apply to exchange students beginning studies in January; however, there are generally fewer applications for housing at that time.
