Important information on examination

Students are expected to attend the mandatory examination at KIT during the official examination period until September. Be aware that earlier or extra examinations for exchange students might not be available and subjected to host university's discretion and approval.

Examination dates vary between KIT departments but generally take place between July and September in semester 2.

Please approach the respective KIT's departmental coordinator <u>at the start</u> <u>of your exchange</u> for the exact examination dates. If the examination date clashes with NUS' academic calendar, please consider taking alternative courses which allows you to have the examination by late July.

Leave of Absence from NUS is subjected to your home faculty's approval and is not guaranteed.

Accommodation

Most students in Karlsruhe live in dormitories or share a flat. There is, however, an acute shortage of living space. KIT cannot guarantee the availability of accommodation but will assist all exchange students settling down in Karlsruhe. Details are sent by email after admission to KIT.

The furnished single rooms cost between €250 and €350 per month and are rented for fixed lease periods: October to March (winter semester) and/or April to September (summer semester). Please note that these rental periods cannot be changed, and no alternative move-in or move-out dates are available.

Students who have contract that ends in August or September are expected to pay for the rental until August or September. There will be **no** refund of the rental if you leave the student accommodation earlier.

Visa

EU citizens and citizens from the following countries do not need a visa to enter Germany: Australia, Canada, Honduras, Iceland, Israel, Japan, Korea, Liechtenstein, Monaco, New Zealand, Norway, San Marino, Switzerland and the United States. However, after entering Germany, you will have to apply for a residence permit at the local "Auslaenderbehörde" (Immigration Office) if you are staying for more than three months.

Students from all other countries must apply for a visa for study purposes via the German diplomatic representation in their home country. **You must not under any circumstances travel to Germany on a tourist visa.**

All students are advised to apply for the necessary visa immediately after they received the official offer letter/email from their host university.

Some visa application process could take up to 2 months to process. Your exchange at the host university depends on the clearance by the immigration of the host country. KIT cannot affect this procedure.

Insurance

All full-time NUS students are covered under the university's Student Group Personal Accident & Medical Insurance and the Student Travel Insurance. For more information on the university medical insurance, please refer to https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/.

Health insurance coverage is compulsory for the entire stay in Germany. Students can take out health insurance in their home country before arriving in Karlsruhe or take out German public health insurance upon arrival during the orientation week.

If you are covered by a private health insurance in your home country, you need to obtain a written confirmation of your health insurance provider (either in German or English) in your home country that states that

- you have a health insurance
- it is valid in Germany
- it provides you with sufficient insurance coverage of €100,000

Please note that regular travel insurance cannot be accepted, since it does not cover your study stay of at least one semester. https://www.intl.kit.edu/istudies/15334.php

It is also recommended that you purchase a comprehensive travel insurance for the full duration of your stay abroad, including your personal travel



	within/outside Germany. Please review your insurance coverages to ensure that they meet your needs. Students are strongly encouraged to assess the risk of their intended activities and purchase supplemental insurance plans to ensure they are adequately covered during their time abroad.
