Language Proficiency Requirement	The following levels are recommended but not required: minimum B2 level in English for English-taught modules. Minimum B1 level in French for French-taught modules.
Course Information	(1) Minimum workload per semester: 15 ECTS credits (2) Maximum workload per semester: 30 ECTS credits
	The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 30 ECTS credits. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer.
	All applicants should have a Science and/or Engineering background and have completed at least 4 semesters at the home institution before studying abroad. Students can select modules only from CentraleSupélec's Engineering Curriculum's 2nd year (fall or spring).
