iv) Examination	Students are expected to attend the mandatory examination at the host university.
v) Curriculum Structure	<p>For the engineering degree, UTT provides training in 5 years with its own integrated preparatory class to obtain the French title of engineer, equivalent to the degree of master.</p> <p>Classes can be taught exclusively and entirely in English or both in French and English. This depends largely on the number of foreign students enrolling in each course. <p>i) Procedures</p>	<p>All NUS student has to be nominated by NUS before they can apply for fee-waiver exchange at the host university.</p> <p>The application procedures and list of supporting documents needed by the host university can be found in the SharePoint.</p> <p>Please look for the SEP coordinator at your Dean’s Office for the link to the SharePoint.</p>
<p>ii) Deadlines</p>	<p>All NUS student must abide by the internal application deadline set by their home faculty for exchange participation in the following academic year. After clearing the internal application and selection process, students have to take note of the application deadline set by the host university</p> <p>Failure to submit a formal application to the host university will result in your exchange being forfeited even if you have been selected by NUS for the exchange.</p>

<p>i) University Accommodation</p>	<p>The UTT can book accommodation for students coming from partner universities. The International Relations Office can book your accommodation and welcome you at your arrival (at the airports in Paris for the non-European students or at the train station in Troyes). Accommodation is guaranteed for students if the application is submitted on time.</p>

<p>F. Visa</p>	
<p>Consular/Visa Regulation</p>	<p>Long-Stay visas are necessary for stays exceeding 3 months. Upon arrival in France, students are required to register with the French Immigration and Integration Office (OFII) for a residence permit.</p> <p>Please visit the websites of French embassies and consulates in your country.</p> <p>All students who wish to study in France must follow the Campus France procedure on Etudes en France online platform before applying for a visa. Please refer to http://www.singapour.campusfrance.org/page/student-visa-stays-france-more-90-days for details.</p> <p>Students can apply up to 3 months prior to the departure. During the peak period (from April to August), students are invited to apply as soon as they can, to avoid any delays, since it can take up to 2 weeks to get an appointment.
