Course Information	<p>(1) Minimum workload per term: 12 credits (approximately 4 courses) (2) Maximum workload per term: 18 credits (approximately 6 courses)</p> <p>A credit unit is earned by approximately 40-50 hours of student work.</p> <p>The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 15 credits. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Accommodation	<p>Exchange students may apply for accommodation at CityUHK Student Residence, but it is not guaranteed due to limited spaces. Visa	<p>All non-local students are required to obtain a student visa to study in Hong Kong SAR.</p> <p>Students must complete an online visa application and send hard copies of application documents to CityU Global Engagement Office by courier/registered mail.</p> <p>As the student visa/entry permit application processing may take 8 weeks or even longer, please adhere to CityU's deadline to submit your visa application.</p>

Insurance	<p>All full-time NUS students are covered under the university's Student Group Personal Accident & Medical Insurance and the Student Travel Insurance. For more information on the university medical insurance, please refer to https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/</p> <p>All non-local students must have adequate insurance for the entire study period at CityUHK. The insurance should, at minimum, cover travel, personal accidents, medical expenses (accident and non-accident), hospitalisation, and emergency evacuation/repatriation. CityUHK recommended that students should also discuss with their insurer to include coverage to strikes, riots, civil commotion, and diseases, including but not limited to epidemic and pandemic diseases. Exchange students may consider CityUHK University-contracted insurance plan for additional coverage.
