Exchange Duration	One semester
Language Proficiency Requirement	UCC do not require students from NUS to provide English test scores.
Course Information	No minimum (UCC ask that students discuss the minimum with their home university) Maximum is 30 ECTS credits per semester. The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 30 ECTS credits. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units
	exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer.
	Not open to exchange students: Ag Science, Law, Medicine, Dentistry Very limited module/class space availability: Computer Science and Film Studies. UCC do not recommend nominating students that need very specific classes in these areas. Accommodation	Students will receive a housing application form with their letter of acceptance. The housing office has a process in place for exchange students. Housing is allocated based on first come, first served. Housing is limited, however UCC have been able to allocate housing to all exchange/visiting students each year. UCC ask that students budget 5,000-6000 euro per semester for housing. UCC housing office work with private housing complexes directly when allocating housing for exchange students. There is no on campus housing available however all complexes are within walking distance to UCC campus. Typically, students will be placed in complexes such as Aislinn House, Broga House, Bottleworks, Lee Point, Coleman Court, Eden Hall.
