Exchange Duration	One semester. Students are encouraged to go for exchange in Semester 2 due to the overlap in academic calendar.				
Language Proficiency Requirement	 Proficiency in English has to be uploaded in the exchange application: An original TOEFL test with an overall band score of at least 90. (TU Delft only accepts the TOEFL internet-based test, TOEFL iBT Special Home Edition test and does not accept TOEFL Mybest scores.) An IELTS (academic version) with an overall Band score of at least 6.5; Not the IELTS Indicator test or the IELTS Online (Academic) test; Proof that you have passed the University of Cambridge 'Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE)' or the University of Cambridge 'Certificate in Advanced English (CAE)' Certificates older than two years are not accepted. Course Information	(1) Minimum workload per semester: 24 credits (2) Maximum workload per semester: 30 credits The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 30 ECTS. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Accommodation	flexible with their course preference. Housing is not guaranteed for exchange students. It is very difficult to find a room in Delft and its surrounding areas. This is due to a shortage of housing in the Netherlands, especially student rooms.
	Make sure to arrange your accommodation before arriving in the Netherlands, as you are officially required to register a valid Dutch address within 5 days after arrival in the Netherlands. Registering a valid Dutch address at the local municipality is a legal obligation for all who intend to stay in the Netherlands for 4 months or more, irrespective of nationality or purpose of stay. A valid and registered address allows you to obtain a BSN (Citizen Service Number), which is needed to interact with Dutch authorities and open a Dutch bank account.
	TU Delft paid housing service can assist in finding accommodation, but the number of available rooms is also limited to 50-60% of incoming exchange students.
	We strongly advise against travelling to the Netherlands without confirmed accommodation, as this may negatively impact your overall exchange experience — including your academic performance and personal wellbeing.

Visa	All non-EU and non-EFTA nationals need a MVV Visa to enter the Netherlands and/or a Residence Permit to be able to follow an exchange programme. TU Delft will apply for the MVV Visa and/or Residence Permit for Study on your behalf at the IND (the Dutch Immigration and Naturalisation Services). It is not possible for you as a student to apply yourself.
